# **NEWS ABOUT US**

## Sue Lidden (Susan Tucker 1957)

It was with great interest that I have read the newsletter passed on by a cousin......another *Old Girl* It led me to dig out my old copies of The Lucerian, which somehow have survived the years and the shifts.

I was a boarder 1954-57, matriculating in 57. After school I went to Teacher's College. I taught in Hamilton and Horsham before being seconded to Papua New Guinea, where I stayed for 10 years. I returned to Australia to live in Wagga Wagga.

### Jenny Hawkins (Sweetten 1959)

I was a pupil at Morongo from 1947 to 1959. I met my best friend Margaret Weddell at Morongo Nursery School in Newtown.

My younger sister, Wendy Cooke, also went to Morongo as did both our daughters. I was the Kindergarten Assistant and my youngest daughter, Amelia, was in Grade 6 in 1996 when Morongo closed. Amelia remained to attend Kardinia International College in 1997.

## Nora Sutorius-Valk (Valk Year 10 1946)

I am honoured to have this opportunity to tell you how it all came about, my coming to Morongo!!!! It was Nov 1945 when I arrived in Australia as a refugee from Java, Indonesia, part of the Dutch East Indies at that time. My family had been in a Japanese concentration camp for three years and on coming out of the camp, I was in an area where fierce fighting had broken out between Indonesian freedom fighters and anyone who was white or sympathized with the Dutch. I was evacuated from Surabaya on a British troop ship to Singapore. My mother had died in the camp of malnutrition, lack of hygiene and medication. My father was a POW and had been transported to Japan for three years, unbeknown to us. When he returned from Japan to Batavia (Jakarta) he searched for his wife and daughter. Through the excellent work of the International Red Cross, he learned of the death of his wife but still did not know where his daughter was. As he was still a pilot with the Dutch East Indies Air force, he was able to fly to Singapore where he was told his daughter might be held. And sure enough, he found me listed in a huge former internment camp. It was like a miracle to me. I had been there about two weeks and still had no idea where my father was. I was allowed to fly back to Batavia with him on the B25 that had brought him to Singapore. Luckily he was allowed three months recuperation leave from the air force. As he was an officer and fighter pilot before the Japanese invaded, he could take me to Australia. It was through an Australian WAAF lady, an ex-pupil of

Morongo that he was put in touch with Miss Shaw. The WAAF pleaded with Miss Shaw to take in this poor refugee. I was 15 and an only child. My father had to return to his job in Java in Feb 1946, after he settled me into the school.

Dina Cannon published the story of my arrival in the newspaper she was working for years later. I have it in my scrapbook. Everyone was curious about this girl!!! My first friend was Dot Brownlees. We remained in touch till a few years ago. A long-time friendship including many visits back and forth between Holland and OZ (Port Fairy) for our families. My grandson, Thys, was the last one who visited with Mark Grimshaw, Dot's son, and actually did some farm work on their property at Springfield! Miss Shaw was exceptional in making me feel welcome, for in the beginning I felt like I had come into another concentration camp! She gave me extra weekends away to visit my Dutch family friends in Melbourne. Eventually I did settle down and made many many friends.

I am still corresponding with, Jan Winstanley, Beverly Williams-Elshaugh, Jan Dix-Bowman, Alison Lloyd-Williams and Margeret Cottle-Welsh. These were all Day girls and had me home for many weekends, which was wonderful. Dot Brownlees used to carry notes back and forth to boys at Geelong College!! Lastly I must mention Margôt Douglas. She was famous because she had run away from school!!! Miss Shaw drove to Melbourne and found her there. Naturally I was fascinated and she was my best Boarder friend! After two years I went back to my father. The money had run out!!!!!! With much sadness I left my friends and eventually went to Holland via Batavia (Jakarta) where my father was still working. Eventually, we all were in Holland to start a new life. I married a Dutchman and we had three children.

Over the years I kept in contact with Morongo. I even organized a Reunion in London when Miss Shaw was traveling through Europe. About 10 old girls living in England got together in London for lunch. Among them was Erica Wallace. I saw Erica again last year. She lives in Tenterton, East Sussex not far from where my daughter lives. Miss Shaw visited us in Holland on another occasion when she was traveling with her sister. I also came back to Geelong for; reunions of my year, the 50th Jubilee in 1970 and finally for Miss Shaw's 100th birthday luncheon on 22 Feb 1998. I have many many photos of all these occasions!!!!!!!

I am now living in a lovely flat just outside of Amsterdam and would be happy to meet with any old collegians traveling through Amsterdam, even put them up for a few days!!!!!

# Margaret Potter (Potts)

Margaret came to Morongo as a Year 10 boarder in 1951. After leaving school, she returned home to Colac to work in her father's pharmacy. She came to Armadale in Melbourne where she worked for a cosmetic company. Margaret remained active playing tennis, golf and bowls. She was very active in her Probus Club. Margaret passed away February 25<sup>th</sup> 2017 aged 80.

# Inga Clendinnen (Jewell)

Inga Clendinnen (Jewell), born on 17 August 1934, died on 8 September 2016.

Inga attended Morongo until 1951, when she completed Matriculation. She then went on to Melbourne University where she completed an Honours degree in history, graduating in 1955. She became a distinguished historian, specialising in the Aztec and Mayan cultures. After a serious illness, she had a liver transplant in 1994, and this meant that she was no longer able to travel overseas for research purposes. Instead she turned her attention to subjects which could be studied from Australia, including indigenous history in colonial times and studies in Nazi Germany. In these areas, too, her work was significant.

Morongo was very innovative encouraging girls in the early 1950s to go on to university, and although not mentioned in her memoir *The Tiger's Eye*, she benefited from this policy. In the 1952 issue of the Lucernian, the School applauds her success as follows:

### Examination Success, 1951 - Inga Jewell

Our congratulations go to Inga Jewell upon her fine achievements in her last year at School. In addition to being Dux of the School for 1951, she obtained a Major Resident Scholarship for entrance to the University Women's College. This award was the result of a competitive examination; Inga's subjects were English Literature and Modern History. She obtained a Commonwealth Scholarship and a University Exhibition, both allotted upon the total of marks gained in the Matriculation Examination. She also shared the Cromarty Prize in English Literature, awarded by the University for second place in English Literature in the Matriculation Examination.
