Student Laptops

Laptops supplied by the College, as part of the student laptop program, are included in the nominated tuition fee.

Building Levy

A \$250 compulsory building levy will be added to each family's fee statement per term. This fee will assist with the College building renewal program and refurbishments.

Payment of Fees

1. Fee accounts will be rendered at the beginning of Terms 1 and 3.
2. Fees are payable half yearly in advance. Fees not paid by the specified date will incur an administration fee which is currently \$150 per account.
3. Each account will also include sundry charges where necessary.
4. A term's notice in writing must be given to the Principal, or half a term's tuition and/or boarding fee is payable before a student leaves the College.
5. Overseas students accepted into the boarding house may not withdraw from the boarding house except at the end of the year and having given at least one term's notice in writing.

Refund Policy for Full Fee Paying Overseas Students

The Geelong College is obliged under the ESOS Act 2008 to pay a refund to overseas students in certain circumstances.

- Withdrawal due to visa not being granted
- Withdrawal before commencement date
- If the College cannot provide the course as agreed with the student, then the College will refund any monies paid by the student
- If a student fails to attend the course or withdraws during the course, after giving the required one term's notice, then the College will refund the unexpired tuition and/or boarding fee received in proportion to the period of the course. If the student fails to give the required one term's notice, then an additional half term's tuition and/or boarding fee will be retained.

Fee Insurance Scheme

The school requires fee insurance cover for students attending the College. This covers both capital payments on accidents 24 hours, seven days a week and pro-rata rebate of tuition and/or boarding fees for absence of 15 consecutive days missed by the student due to illness, accident or contact with infection outside the school. The pro-rata rebate of tuition and/or boarding fees is capped at two terms.

The cost associated with this insurance is \$18 per term for boarding students. This will be billed directly to the fee account. Further information can be obtained from the Finance Department in Davey House and the Parent Portal.

Overseas Student Health Cover

The Department of Immigration and Citizenship has advised that, in order to be granted a student visa, all applications lodged after 1 July 2010 must provide evidence that the student has Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the proposed duration of their visa.

OSHC will help pay for medical and hospital care and will contribute towards the cost of most prescription medicines and emergency ambulance transport. It does not cover dental, physiotherapy, optical or other ancillary services.

Other

Uniform, Books and Stationery are additional items of cost for parents, with the exact amount of each dependent upon the age and stage of the student. Most trips will also attract a cost to parents, but this will be notified at the time of planning of these ventures. Please refer to the College Education Agreement on the College website.
